

### The Passive - Use

-To indicate that the object is more important than the subject



-Subject is irrelevant, obvious or unknown.

E.g. Somebody **bought** the new device The new device was bought

# Active Passive: Changes

- Verb **to be** carries the same tense as the main verb in active voice
- Main verb takes the past participle form
- Will, be going to, modals do not change: the following verb **IS** transformed into passive.
- -When included, subject from the active voice sentence moves to final position, using a preceding by.

### Structure

**Affirmative:** Subject + to be + past participle of main verb.

**E.g.** Amazon sells books (active) → Books are sold by Amazon

**Negative:** Subject + to be + <u>not</u> + past participle of main verb.

**E.g.** Amazon doesn't sell books (active) → Books are <u>n't</u> sold by Amazon

With MODALS, PERFECT TENSES, FUTURE SIMPLE (WILL) add NOT to the modal, have / has , will e.g. Books won't be sold by Amazon

### Structure

**Interrogative:** (QW) + To be + subject + past participle of main verb.

E.g. Are books sold by Amazon?

With MODALS, PERFECT TENSES, FUTURE SIMPLE (WILL) = (QW)+ modal, have/has, will + subject + To be + past participle of main verb.

E.g. (When) will books be sold by Amazon?

#### Present simple

Amazon **sells** books (active)—Books **are sold** by Amazon (passive)

#### Past simple

Amazon **sold** books (active)—Books **were sold** by Amazon (passive)

#### **Present continuous**

Amazon **is selling** books (active) → Books **are being sold** by Amazon (passive)

#### Past cont.

Amazon was selling books (active)— Books were being sold by Amazon (passive)

#### **Future simple**

Amazon will sell books (active) = Books will be sold by Amazon (passive)

#### Be going to

Amazon is going to sell books (active) = Books are going to be sold by Amazon (passive)

#### **Present perfect**

Amazon **has sold** books (active) = Books **have been sold** by Amazon (passive)

#### Past perfect

Amazon **had sold** books (active) = Books **had been sold** by Amazon (passive)

#### **Modals**

Amazon **should sell** books (active) = Books **should be sold** by Amazon (passive)

#### **Modal perfects**

Amazon could have sold books (active) = Books could have been sold by Amazon (passive)

#### **Have to**

Amazon **has to** sell books (active) = Books **have to be sold** by Amazon (passive)

# Sentences with TWO objects

We will give a computer to Paul (active)

Paul will be given a computer (passive)

A computer will be given to Paul (passive)

# Further knowledge...

Passive sentences with SAY / THINK / BELIEVE / KNOW / REPORT =

It + verb in passive + that [S+V+O]

E.g. "Coronavirus first originated in China" (active)

It is said that coronavirus first originated in China (passive)

S + verb in passive + infinitive

Coronavirus is known to be dangerous to our health (passive)

# THE CAUSATIVE (Have/get sth done)

Used for actions that someone else does for us.

- We use HAVE or GET + N + past participle

E.g. I should have my hair CUT

Emma got her house painted last week
